Let's take a look at today's Bible verse.




**“How great is our Lord! His power is absolute!

## Invisible Ink (Omnipresent)


Items needed: Lemon Juice and a Hair Dryer



What are some things that you cannot see, but you know are present? (Wind, air, gravity, etc.) Did you know that Jesus is always near you? Just like we couldn't see this message, we can't see Jesus. But just like the message was always on this piece of paper, Jesus is always with us. When are some times you are afraid? (When I am at a new school, when I'm lost or alone, when it is dark, when I am in a new place.) During scary times, we can remember that Jesus is always with us. Jesus is Omnipresent which means He is always present.

Because Jesus is always present, we should worship Him. We don't need to be afraid, we can talk to Him at any time. He is always with us everywhere, all the time, and we are never alone.
